A special report in reference to the BPPSD, Black Panther Party for Self Defense, Chairman BOBBY SEALE, Prime Minister STOKELY CARMICHAEL; ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Minister of Information; HUEY P. NEWTON, Minister of Defense. May 2, 1968 - Approximately 125 people.

Subject a special meeting was held at Saint Augustine's Church, 27 th and West Streets in Oakland, for the purpose. to celebrate the first annual anniversary of the invasion of the State Legislature. BOBBY SEALE said we are going to control our neighborhoods if the cracker, honky, racist, white pig cops invade our society they will answer to the Black Panther Party. BOBBY SEALE made comments on the white power structure trying to destroy the leadership, but they will not succeed.

Comment: Incidentally officamera BOBBY SEALE said that this group calling itself John Brown Society wants to join the Black Panther Party. BOBBY said they will let them join and it will make a triangular coalition between the John Brown Party, Black Panther Party and the Peace and Freedom Party, but BOBBY SEALE said there will be one condition and that's if the Black Panthers can control everything.

JAMES BALDWIN, author of many books and his best selling novel "The Fire Next Time" and the first statement he

made was that his next book will be called "The Fire This Time." He said that he is working on a movie for MGM, the life story and autobiography of MALCOLM $X$. He said he would be back to the area. Incidentally, this meeting was

San Francisco, California November 25, 1968


This meeting was very crowded and the audience was mostly a white audience with very few Panthers in evidence. Among those from Marin County observed at this gathering were:

GOLDIE JONES
MEYER BAYLIN
RICHARD \& JEAN WERTHIMER
KEN HANSEN


JESSICA MITFORD was the mistress of ceremonies and ROBERT SCHEER of "Ramparts" Magazine made the introductory remarks. KATHLEEN CLEAVER was present but did not speak. ELDRIDGE CLEAVER said something about he did not know what to say but generally talked about his background and said that while he was raised as a tough kid in the slums he really learned to be a criminal in prison. He stated that he expects to go back to San Quinten prison with "dirty red" NELSON, the warden. ELDRIDGE CLEAVER gave his usual very rambling speech and blasted Mayor AllOTS of San Francisco and mentioned that HUEY NEWTON is trying to improve his mind in prison and is not working in the prison industries.

CHARLES GARY, the attorney, spoke and said that they must keep up the fight to prevent EIDRIDGE CLEAVER from going back to jail and said it was a political case. He mentioned in his speech that the State of California and other states have an agreement where they can exchange prisoners who are troublesome and he suggested that CLEAVER possibly might be transferred from a California prison to a prison in another state.

There was an art auction of art from "Ramparts" Magazine.

EMORY DOUGLAS, the Black Panther Party (BPP) Minister of Culture, did not speak.

JULES FERFFER the cartoonist, was not there, nor was JAMES BALDWIN. PHILLIP OCHS played the guitar

observed talking to BOBBY SEALE of the BPP and SEALE and others of the Panther group were discussing what they mean by revolution and they said generally that they want to turn the system in the United States upside down as far as the blacks are concerned so that the blacks are up on top with the whites. The conclusion was that if it could be done within the present system, this was fine, and if not, then it was proof that the present system will not work and they left their argument hanging there. ( ( ) U
was also observed talking to BOBBY SEALE and when he asked her about the events at SanFrancisco State College she said that she was going to picket even though she did not whole heartedly support some of the people involved in the strike at San Francisco State and some of the things that were done, although she did give her whole hearted support to the black students. She stated that she was disturbed by the fact that agreements were made over bad demands and over good demands and then nothing was done so that nothing was achieved as far as the good demands were concerned. She stated that generally every time someone got an agreement with an authority at San Francisco State they claimed that they were double crossed and in turn the authorities at San Francisco State claimed that they had been double crossed by people above them and she described it as generally a mess.

The May 1, 1971 issue of the Swiss Frenchlanguage communist newspaper contained an article which read as follows in translation:
"Free Angela Davis
"The life of Angela Davis is from now on in the hands of Ronald Reagan, racist and fascist governor of California, and of the tribunal which should judge her, but she will be among us if a unanimous and powerful protest is raised to disarm the executioner.
"Accused without evidence of being the instigator of an escape of black prisoners, she has been accused of worse: of being a young black woman, a philosopher, and above all, a communist.!
"Why are her accusers holding so to their prey? It is because in her are united in an exemplary manner the beginning struggles of the Americans with the principal problems of their society: youth and the students, the blacks, capitalism and Vietnam.
"But it is also because these problems are ours or that we solidarize with the struggles which they raise that we demand the immediate liberation of Angela Davis, member of the American Communist Party and of the Black Panther Party.
"'Free Youth,' supported by our newspaper, like other organizations in Geneva or in Switzerland, has conducted a campaign for her liberation and has sent a petition with more than 1600 signatures to the united States Embassy in Bern. They also sent a message of solidarity directly to Angela Davis. Vigilance should not be relaxed, and all sorts of actions should be pursued."

It is common knowfeaferin Switzerland that "Free Youth" is the youth organization of the Communist Party of Switzerland (CPS).

Information has been received from the American Embassy, Bern, that a printed sheet was circulated in Switzerland in May, 1971, which read as follows in translation from German:
"Help to free Angela Davis
"The story of Angela Davis is the story of political oppression: oppression as a woman, oppression as an Afro-American, oppression as a leftist. She was dismissed from the University of California on political grounds. Without regard to her unusual achievements as a student and professor, achievements which no one, not even her enemies, deny. Her participation in illegal actidities has not been proven.' Despite this, the American federal police, the FBI,"placed Angela Davis on the list of the ten most wanted persons. Press and television gave this case the greatest publicity. President Nixon appeared before the American television cameras to personally thank Edgar Hoover, chief of the FBI, for capturing 'this dangerous woman'. Which means a sort of conviction-in-advance. With this he instigated hate and enmity against the Afro-American freedom movement as never before.
"Can Angela Davis still expect a just trial at all under such circumstances? She dedicated her life to the struggle against oppression and injustice, the struggle for the blacks and oppressed of the whole world.
"At present Angela Davis is confined in one of the most fearful prisons in the U. S. Her trial can last years. Regardless of whether she is innocent or guilty: her trial will be a trial of a society of violence and injustice:: A society which is responsible for Angela's present situation. A society which is in the process of destroying its strongest accuser.
"Angela Davis is fighting for her life. Only the greatest protest throughout the world, a universal protest which will not let itself be stifled, can still save her life.
"Herbert Marcuse, Professor of phitosophy, university of California

"The undersigned persons protest against the injust arrest of Angela Davis and her delivery to the California authorities. We demand that the government of the United States use all its influence to prevent the threatening legal murder of Angela Davis, which would be only one in the endless chain of murders of Afro-Americans.

Approximately 430 of these slips, some with more than one signature, were received by the Embassy. In addition, a typed scroll on which the names of those signing the slips appeared, was also received at the embassy. This scroll was headed as follows:

Many people in the whole world are following with fear and increasing anxiety the destiny of Angela Davis, the fighter for civic rights. We wonder how the administration of the law of her country claims the right to charge Angela Davis with murder. Nevertheless Angela Davis was put on the list of the most searched criminals, therefore the following people signed to protest against the unjustified arrest of Angela Davis and her extradition to the California Authorities.
